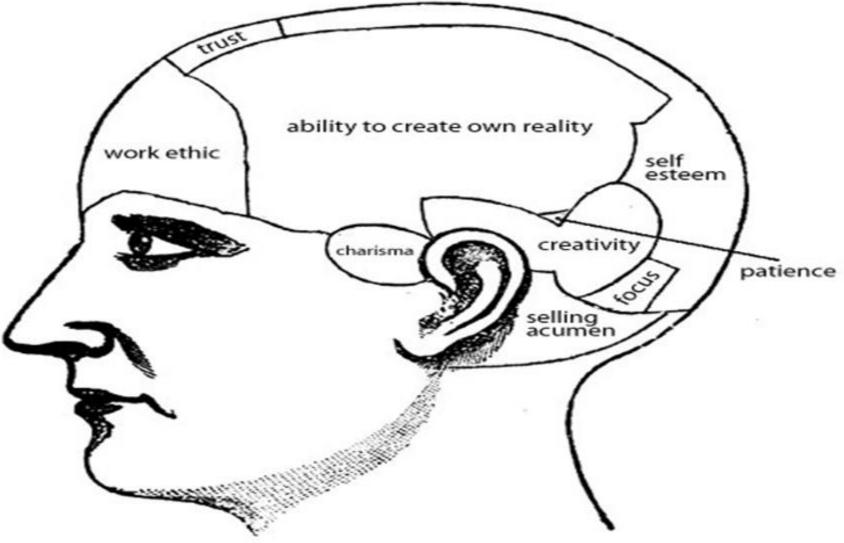

- Entrepreneur able to identify and capitalize opportunities by bringing together human, financial and other materials to form a fruitful business

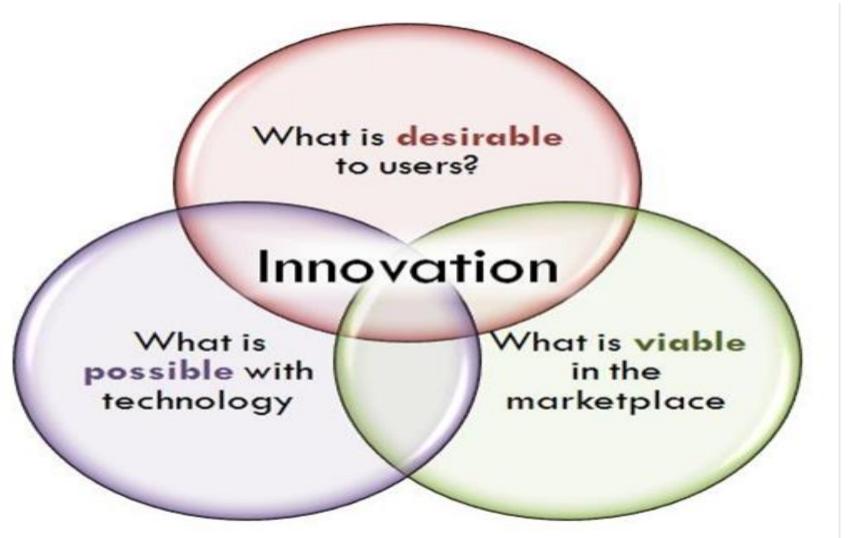

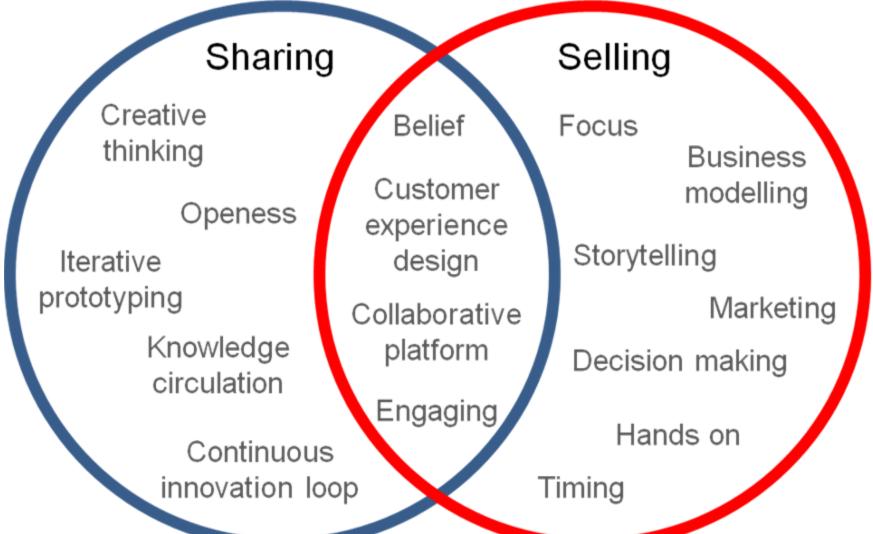
Entrepreneur

Inventiveness Mind



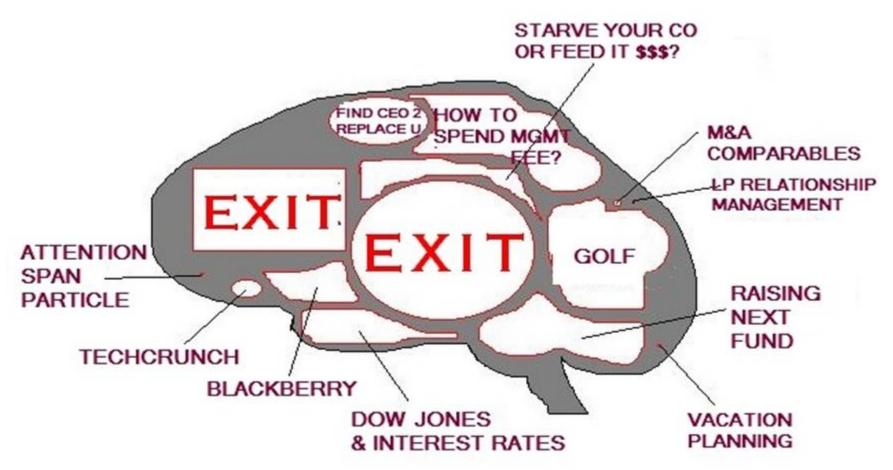
Innovator -> Entrepreneur

- Build leadership skills and gives an experience of working under pressure to solve real business issues

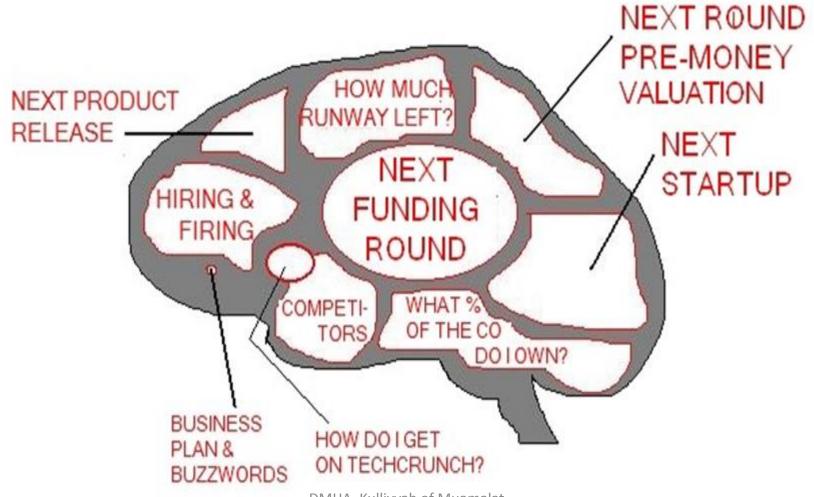

Business Plan (BP)

- As master plan that show start steps and develop business
- Contains detailed business information such as analysis, forecast, business implementation strategy
- As guideline for managing business, evaluate and review performance, provide assurance to external parties and maximize resources to increase productivity

Business Plan (content)

- [1] Business Background
- [2] Executive Summary
- [3] Industrial Analysis
- [4] Description of Business (Product or Services)
- [5] Production Plan
- [6] Marketing Plan
- [7] Organization Plan
- e.g. goal strategy, structure planning, organization chart, asset, financial planning (project costing, funding source, cash flow, profit and loss, balance sheet)
