He has published various books and writings particularly in Islam Philosophy. The followings are among his achievements in publication:


- Dakwah Islam Pada Masa Kini

CONVOCATION 2015

From 20th - 21st October 2015, 17th Insaniah's convocation ceremony was held at Tuanku Permaisuri Hajah Haminah Hall in Kuala Ketil campus. Pro-Chancellor I, Yang Teramat Mulia Dato' Seri Diraja Tan Sri Tunku Sallehuddin Ibni Almarhum Sultan Badlishah was present to confer degrees first and during the second sessions while the last session was officiated by Pro Chancellor II, Yang Berbahagia Dato' Wira Dr Affifudin Bin Haji Omar. 1134 Approximately, graduates received their recognitions. In the first session, two graduates were conferred Ph.D (Doctor Philosophy) in Usulludin and Arabic Language respectively, while 29 graduates were conferred a Master Degree. The rest of 917 and 186 received their Bachelor and Diploma of their respective courses.

Like it or not, haze has become an annual affair in Malaysia. During dry season in September to December, open burnings in Sumatera and Kalimantan contribute the haze problem in Malaysia, Indonesia and Singapore.

What is actually haze?

Mist, fog and haze share almost similar characteristic. They appear as cloudy suspended grey smoke in the air. Mist and fog is a phenomenon caused by small droplets of water suspended in air. They do not cause serious health effect. Haze is made up of tiny particulate, smoke and dust

suspended. Two major sources of haze are fossil oil burning from transport and open burning from agriculture.

Air Quality and Pollution Measurement

Particulate matter

Haze is measured by the concentration of suspended particle in the air (Total Suspended Particle (TSP. Particulate matter (PM) larger than 10 micron usually get trap in the airway when inhaled. Particulate matters (PM) of 10 microns and less (PM_{10}) in diameter enter the airway and cause respiratory problems. PM₁₀ and PM_{2.5} are two different parameters used by the environmentalist to measure air pollution index (API). Finer size of particulate matters enter deeper into the lung tissue and cause more damage.

Health effect of haze

Among the signs and symptoms are irritation to the skin, eye, nose and throat. Respiratory symptoms caused by inhalation of polluted air are cough and breathlessness. Children and old people suffer more from haze especially those with underlying lung problems like bronchitis, emphysema, asthma, pneumonia and coronary heart disease.

AQI	Air Pollution Level	Health Implications
0 - 50	Good	Air quality is considered satisfactory, and air pollution poses little or no risk
51 -100	Moderate	Air quality is acceptable; however, for some pollutants there may be a moderate health concern for a very small number of people who are unusually sensitive to air pollution.
101-150	Unhealthy for Sensitive Groups	Members of sensitive groups may experience health effects. The general public is not likely to be affected.
151-200	Unhealthy	Everyone may begin to experience health effects; members of sensitive groups may experience more serious health effects
201-300	Very Unhealthy	Health warnings of emergency conditions. The entire population is more likely to be affected.
300+	Hazardous	Health alert: everyone may experience more serious health effects

Preventive measure

The basis of preventive measure is to minimize contact with polluted air. Outdoor activities should be avoided since outdoor air quality is heavily polluted. Vigorous activities especially sport activities should be stopped since the more air is inhaled; the larger dose of particulate matter is absorbed into the lungs.

Drink lots of water

People should drink more water during the haze season. Adequate hydration improves the function of airway in trapping and expulsing the inhaled particulate matters.

Personal protection

If being outdoor is unavoidable, the use of face mask is recommended. A number of facemasks is recommended. The quality of face mask is indicated by their filtering capability of particulate matter from entering the airway.

3MN95 face mask claimed to be able to filter 95% of PM_{2.5}. This is recommended because of it

repeated can be used repeatedly, convenient, minimal leaking and cheap (Figure 1). The second type of mask is Vog mask which has similar quality as the 3MN95 mask. Vog mask is easier to apply and more acceptable to children (Figure 2).

Rabies is a zoonotic (diseases of the animal). It is caused by rabies virus. The rabies virus survives in animal reservoirs, including bats, monkeys, raccoons, foxes, wolves, dogs, mongoose, weasels, cats, cattle and other domestic farm animals, bears and other wild carnivores. In Malaysia dog is the main animal reservoir.

In Malaysia, the last case of human rabies was reported in 1998 in Kedah. In September 2015, a husband and wife were bitten by their own dog in Kedah. This dog is confirmed as rabid dog. Since then several dog bites cases were reported. Veterinary department declared Rabies outbreak in September 2015 in Perlis, Kedah and Penang.

Transmission of rabies virus from animal to human is through animal bite. Saliva of the affected animal contains rabies virus. When the animal bites another animal or human, the virus will enter the body through the wound. Transmission from human to human has never been recorded.

The incubation period of rabies varies from 1-3 months. Initial symptoms of rabies are fever and pain or an unusual or unexplained pricking tingling, or burning sensation (paraesthesia) at the wound site. As the virus spreads through the central nervous system. progressive, fatal inflammation of the brain and spinal cord develops.

Two forms of the disease can follow. People with furious rabies exhibit signs of hyperactivity,

excited behavior, hydrophobia and sometimes aerophobia. After a few days, death occurs by cardiorespiratory arrest.

Paralytic rabies accounts for about 30% of the total number of human cases. The muscles gradually become paralyzed, starting at the site of the bite or scratch. A coma slowly develops, and eventually death occurs. Case fatality rate of clinically confirmed human rabies is more than 95%.

What to do if you are bitten by dog?

It is safer to assume any dog bite as rabies dog. This is especially true if the biting is unprovoked. Immediately wash the bite wound thoroughly with water and soap. Wash for about 15 minutes. If available, use detergent or antiseptic (diluted Clorox solution).

Get further treatment from the hospital. In the hospital, vaccination against rabies will be administered. Rabies immunoglobulin will be given if indicated.

Prevention of rabies outbreak among dogs is through vaccination. Veterinary Department provides vaccination service for pet dogs. As for stray dogs, mass vaccination through bait has been implemented in other countries. Culling of stray dogs is the cheaper alternative.

INSANIAH MEDIC CONVENTION

On 12th September 2015, Academic Exco of Insaniah Medical Student Association (IMSA) in collaboration with Department of Student Affairs, Insaniah University College organized Insaniah Medic Convention at Sultan Abdul Halim Hall in Mergong Campus, Alor Setar. The objective of this convention is to discuss the current medical issues from Islamic perspectives. Besides, this event was also held to promote new Insaniah campus in Kuala Ketil to the public. Medic Convention Program was launched by Dato' Nurhizan Binti Ismail began from 8.00 am to 5.00 pm.

There were about 180 participants who came from various universities such as Islamic Science University of (USIM), Cyberjaya Malaysia University College of Medical Sciences (CUCMS), International University of Islamic Malaysia (UIAM). Royal College of Medicine Perak (RCMP) and Islamic College of Science and Technology (KIST). Approximately 60 committee members were involved in that day working in units such as protocol. sponsorship, public affairs, publicity,

accommodation, technical and special task.

About 8 invited speakers involved namely Dr. Murizah binti Ahmad Zain, Dr. Akli bin Ahmad, Dr. Jamnul Azhar bin Mulkan, Dr. Syed Abdul Khaliq, Dr. Rohani binti Desa, Prof Dr. Abdul Latiff bin Mohamed, Dr. Khairul Hafidz Alkhair bin Khairul Amin and Dr. NurHadi bin Zahlan. They were deliberating on issues such as Obstetrics and Gynecology (O & G), vaccine and its risk, harm reduction and housemanship training

The event started with the speakers exploring the relevance of home birth in Malaysia, usage of contraception and in vitro fertilization (IVF). In the session, the speakers deliberated on the Islamic approval in the usage of prohibited ingredients for vaccine manufacturing. In the third slot namely harm reduction the speakers concurred that treatment which cause harm to the patients is rejected in Islam by giving example intentional methadone administration to drug addicts to overcome the drug misuse. The speakers talked about also

termination of pregnancy in which the Islamic scholars agreed that abortion is forbidden after 120 days of pregnancy. The final session has speakers talking about the new policy on housemen intake and the speakers also mentioned several good ethics that have to be instilled in young medical doctors.

Overall, the program was deemed a success and most of the participants were satisfied with the contents and new knowledge delivered by the speakers. Medical students in particular benefited most from this convention and most of them express their hope of attending similar program in future.





Association of Plasma C - reactive protein (CRP) and Coronary Heart Disease: Study in Bangladesh

C-reactive protein (CRP) is an acute phase protein found to be significantly higher among coronary heart disease patients. The objective of this study was to compare the CRP levels in the patient group and the control group as well as to determine the association of CRP with IHD. This comparative study was carried out in the Department of Biochemistry, Chittagong Medical College Hospital (CMCH), Bangladesh. The study population consists of patients admitted to the Coronary Care Unit (CCU) of CMCH from July 2007 to June 2008. Total 72 participants were included with proper informed consent where 40 were patients and 32 were in the control group. Data was collected using a validated structured questionnaire consists of demographic data, data on medical illness, physical examination results as well as results of serum CRP which was measured using

Nycocard ® CRP Single test. All statistical analyses were done by SPSS and data were expressed as mean ±SD.Total 38.9% participants out of 72 patients had elevated plasma level of CRP. Comparison between the case and control group showed the mean plasma CRP was significantly higher in case group (p<0.001). All these positive cases were found in the case group which reflects a good association of CRP level with IHD.Patients with chronic ischemic heart disease showed to have higher level of CRP. Therefore, CRP is a promising predictive biomarker of coronary risk and is more suitable to use for routine clinical and epidemiological purposes.







Medical education is an ever developing issue. Tens of years ago theory teaching was mainly conducted by dictating lectures with all the possible errors in the process of hearing from the lecturer to writing in a notebook in addition to writing with a chalk on a blackboard. This has improved with the use of hand written transparent sheets on an over head projector to shine a large screen. The introduction of power point presentation has tremendously changed the way the lecturer transfers the knowledge to their students with more illustrations and visual effects.

In Insaniah a new experience has been in use since last month by doing online tests for students during their surgical posting by emailing the questions simultaneously to all members of the group and receiving answers by an allocated time.

The key answers will be sent after receiving all

replies from the students and ask students to mark themselves.

Further verbal discussion with the students on (What went wrong?) and (How to improve outcome?) will be arranged the next meeting. One may wonder what if the students refer to their books or lectures i.e. Is it a sort of cheating? Are the results biased? Simply the idea of the test is to highlight the important points that we need to fix in the minds of the students and it does not matter if they answer from books or lectures, if they find a breather within the allocated time limit.

We need to hear more feedbacks from students to improve the outcome of this new experience.
